Conferencing at École Holy Cross School

Welcome to your child's conference, here are some questions you might consider asking your child's teacher:

- What are your expectations for my child?
- Is my child showing growth in all subject areas?
- Is my child working to his or her fullest potential?
- How is my child's self-esteem?
- Does my child contribute/participate in class?
- Does my child complete the assignments?
- Does my child make good use of class time?
- Does my child seek extra help, if needed?
- What extra help is available?
- Does my child show good behavior in class?
- What can I do at home to support learning in the classroom?

The conference is a good opportunity to thank your child's teacher. Mention any projects or schoolwork your child has enjoyed or is excited about.

Parent Corner

Early absences lead to school problems later. You woke up late and you wonder whether to take your child to school. After all, will one absence matter? The answer is yes. A large-scale review of research shows that children put their entire school career at risk when they are absent in the early years. The learning they miss is hard to make up. Still, it can be a challenge to get a family out the door on time. Here's how:

- **Get ready the night before.** Lay out what our child will wear. Make sure she has everything that she needs to take a school.
- **Establish routines.** Create a chart of the things your child needs to do each day. When it's a routine, she won't argue about it.
- **Allow extra time.** Set your alarm clock a few minutes early. Allow yourself an extra five or 10 minutes to get to school.
