

Parent Corner

Talk to your child about showing respect for teachers, classmates. Respectful behavior is vital for education. When students have respect for teachers and classmates, they help create the positive academic environment all children need to be successful. Whether your child's classes are in person or online, encourage her to:

- Address the teacher by name. Simply saying "Good morning, Mrs. Jones" is an easy way to show respect.
- **Be courteous.** She should say *please* and *thank you* to her teacher and her classmates.
- Raise her hand. When she waits to be called on, she demonstrates self-control and respect for others.
- Do what's expected. Everyone in the class has a job to do. If the teacher doesn't plan any lessons, no one can learn anything. If students don't do their jobs-completing homework, listening to others- it makes it more difficult to learn.
- Listen to the teacher's comments.

 Teachers want students to learn and to

succeed. That means they have to point out mistakes. Your child will do much better in school if she can recognize and accept constructive feedback.
